Vida and the whole Committee are here to help if you need it.



<u>The Mandibles – A family 2029-2047 by Lionel</u> <u>Shriver</u>



The Mandibles, in common with many recent novels is dystopian, but the cause of the societal collapse is not, invasion, climate change or pandemic, but total collapse of the world economy.

Set in New York in 2029, the Mandible family have for generations, been wealthy, although the present generation

of the Old Man's children, live in expectation of wealth rather than it being their present reality.

The international financial collapse has created a world currency crisis which leads to a rejection of the dollar and the creation of the bancour for international trade. The USA crippled by its enormous national debt refuses to adopt the bancour and clings to the dollar, although it is no longer an internationally recognised currency. Trade therefor collapses, and the savings of millions are wiped out. There are increasing shortages, and in time scarcity of all products as well as food and water. As the situation worsens, life deteriorates into total anarchy.

We see each of the children's families initially adapting in their own way, washing up and showering in 'grey water', eating anything available, and finding ways to keep warm without heating. In spite of having to negotiate a society in ruins, the branches of the family, do not support each other. For this family group, their initial stark adjustment is accepting that they are no longer important people and cannot expect to return to their comfortable lives in the future. It is a clever portrait of the effect of expected wealth which not only doesn't materialise but plunges them into a life of chaos. Each small family group adapts in their own ways until the situation

is so dire that most of them are homeless and they have to find unthinkable solutions.

As with most dystopian novels, perhaps the most interesting elements are the responses of the characters to dramatic change. Here, a tenured university professor is sacked, the least successful sister manages to house and feed the entire extended family, and the family black sheep Jarred, provides an escape for them all. Perhaps the central character is Willing, a fourteen-year-old boy who seems to be the only family member who really understands the reasons for the financial crash and what it will mean for all their futures.

As we move into 2047 the national crisis has subsided into a bland personally chipped society, in which even taxes are taken directly via a brain chip. Many of the family members have returned to a much-changed New York and adapted in rather different ways to the new reality. Finally, a more hopeful solution is sought via a move to Nevada.

This is a very wide-ranging novel over, time, characters and US geography. The one weakness I felt was the many pages devoted to economic theory and explanations of how the crash had occurred. These are couched as arguments between our characters, but it is all very technical and totally US centric.

Lionel Shriver has written many novels. She was recently lauded for, We Need to Talk about Kevin, which was made into a successful film. The Mandibles was published in 2016.

Lionel Shriver (born **Margaret Ann Shriver**; May 18, 1957) is an American author and journalist who lives in the <u>United Kingdom</u>. Her novel <u>We Need to Talk About Kevin</u> won the <u>Orange Prize for Fiction</u> in 2005.

Shriver was born **Margaret Ann Shriver** on May 18, 1957, in <u>Gastonia</u>, North Carolina, to a religious family. Her father, Donald, is a <u>Presbyterian</u> minister, who became an academic and president of the <u>Union Theological Seminary</u> in New York; her mother, Peggy, was a homemaker. She also has an older brother, Gregory, and a younger brother, Tim. At age 15, she changed her name from Margaret Ann to Lionel because she did not like the name she had been given, and as a <u>tomboy</u> felt a conventionally male name more appropriate.

The leeks seem to be doing ok at the allotment and the French Beans have been producing so many I have already had to freeze some, we have had some lovely Broccoli and they are still producing well; I'm sad that my Butternut Squash plants are doing well and neither are the pumpkins I was hoping to grow for Halloween but that is all down to lack of watering at the allotment, basically the gardeners fault, sometimes there are just not enough hours in the day and we have to accept that.

Keep doing your best but don't beat yourself up if you cannot get it all done.

Bell

It is many years since the 1749 bell received any serious attention and it has not been possible to ring it recently. The following work has now been carried out by John Taylor & Co of Loughborough to restore it to good working order.

resetting the striking mechanism replacing the bearings replacing the headstock tuning the bell turning the bell so that the clapper strikes on unworn areas of the sound bow installing ball bearing chime pulleys and smooth turned floor bosses.

We are very fortunate that the only remaining bell restoration company is local to us and we are grateful to John Taylor & Co for their care and attention. We also thank the Quintas Fund for their generous grant and other local people who contributed to enable this important project to completed.

You can ring us with specific queries about your caring role, or just for a chat or to offload. If we can't help, we will signpost you to someone who can.

We run Carers Support Groups in each district of Leicestershire, currently by Zoom but returning face to face when Covid allows. The Melton group is at 2:30pm on the second Wednesday of each month. We also offer Telephone Befriending, advice on benefits available to carers, support with completing Carers Assessments, and a Carers Passport which was introduced in November 2020. The Carers Passport is recognised across Leicester, Leicestershire, and Rutland, and is your key to unlocking help and support in a variety of situations.


